From the Pastor's Desk



**Hallelujah!
Christ is risen.**

**Christ is risen indeed.
Hallelujah!**

This Easter proclamation still rings in our ears. We live in the dawning of a new day of God's promised love and life for each of us—and for the whole of creation.

Yet, we know so well, it is easy to fall back into the way things were. We simply go back to the lives we've known. Following Easter a few years ago I was at Luther Seminary in the cafeteria line behind a seminary student who was declaring, "now he can eat sweets and butter again" (his Lenten discipline now done and Easter arrived). He reminded me that with the "arrival of Easter" we go back to work, school, and life with merely a nod to this last Sunday and the season that led up to it.

It is sad to see the impact of the Lenten journey and the proclamation of Easter fade so quickly for some. I invite us to consider how it continues to impact our daily and weekly living.

The announcement that the tomb is empty and that Christ is among the living is meant to inspire, challenge,

and claim us each day. God in Jesus has drawn near to us in the building and sharing of community, the connection of prayer, the angst of separation, the despair of death and loss, the power of life that overcomes hatred, brokenness, and death. From the journey to the cross to the rolling back of the stone, we see the Holy One drawing near to us in profound and intimate ways.

And now, each day and each week, we are invited to tune our lives to the heartbeat of God unleashed in new ways in the world. Our relationship to God through Christ causes us not to simply stand in awe or cast our eyes to heaven, but rather to go deeper into the ways that God meets us in our very living and being. Easter goes beyond a story of Jesus two thousand years ago. Easter is the story of God's people experiencing new life and proclaiming that life to all as part of the story of this one who lived, who died, and who unleashes new life (resurrection) in the world.

As Christians, we gather each week on Sunday. Each Sunday is called to be a "mini-Easter" or a celebration of Easter. Each week we are invited to experience and hear again the proclamation that

God's promise is not bound to the past—that it is not dead in the world. Rather we hear and see again that in gathering, offering of prayers, speaking and working for justice, extending welcome, in the word read, sung, and preached that God is here and now at work among us.

The questions become, how will we live as Easter people? How will we live as people whom God will not forsake...as people whom God claims and reclaims in love and grace?

We will explore these questions in the coming weeks. But here in this newsletter will be some ways to consider living as Easter people.

Experiencing God in Community

We often catch glimpses of God in connection and care for others. Are there ways you are being drawn to connect with others in the coming weeks and months. Perhaps signing up for the Progressive Dinner and getting to know new people? Serving as a Sunday school teacher or confirmation mentor in the fall? Does serving as an usher, greeter, or communion deacon over the summer speak to ways you can connect with others? Or perhaps simply connecting through the Women's Patio Series, the Men's Bible & Brew, or our church outing to the Saints game this summer? How might these opportunities bring new life?

Experience God in Justice

We have people at St. Michael's who are actively involved in accompanying a community and congregation in Cimiento, Guatemala. Does global partnership inspire and challenge you? The congregational council will be voting to become Reconciling in Christ (that means sharing the witness of

the learning, work, and welcome we already do in a more public way with those who are LGBTQ) in August. We have community members purchasing food for the food shelf and delivering it; walking with families who have immigrated and are seeking asylum; engaged in conversations at the state capitol. Are you willing to be part of and see resurrection in the work for justice?

Experience God in Nurture & Care

Perhaps connecting with more people or taking on projects just isn't a possibility right now. It may be that showing up for worship is about all you can do because of busy lives or things happening in the lives of family and friends. It may be that worship, pastoral care, or a call or card from the Befrienders is the way that God will show up for you this Easter season. We hope that you also hear that word of care and support. God, in Jesus, shows up and in many cases just breathes and speaks a word of peace into the hearts and lives of those who are hurting, wondering, or despairing.

In the promise beyond the tomb we experience the Holy One in new ways, and we live as people whose lives cannot simply return to "the way things were." We become recipients and proclaimers of new life...in community, in justice, in both giving and receiving nurture and care...as we walk in the ways of the risen Christ.

Blessed Easter...Christ is risen indeed!


19 youth and four adults will make their way to Little Rock, Arkansas to do ministry with Ferncliff Camp and other local organizations.

Colegio Luterano Agustino de Guatemala

The elementary school in Guatemala City, Colegio Luterano Agustino de Guatemala (CLAG), needs to relocate. Currently, the school resides near a steep ravine that is crumbling away. With each heavy rainfall, chunks of rock and soil fall from the cliff. The government has told everyone in this neighborhood to move, including the school.

This Lutheran school has served children in this marginalized area since 2000, keeping them out of gangs and offering opportunities for the future. The four teachers and 100 students are doing great things and were recently recognized for excellence by the Guatemala Department of Education.

As partners with the Iglesia Luterana Agustina de Guatemala, we have provided \$1,000 to partner with the school and other congregations to raise the funds needed to purchase a lot with a structure that can be retrofitted for four classrooms, an office, and a play area for the children.

St. Michael's is blessed with wonderful and wonderfully gifted staff members. We have the opportunity to support them in their work, help them continue to grow, and share the ways that their work and ministry has been significant to us (individually and as a congregation).

From April 23 to June 1 the Personnel & Administration Committee is inviting congregation members to provide input that we might incorporate into staff feedback for this program year.

If you would like to provide any feedback, you can fill out a form in the church office or send an e-mail to either Jane Doyle, P&A Committee Chair, or Patty Bales, one of the council liaisons to the P&A Committee. You may provide feedback for one or for any number of staff. We do ask that any feedback you submit has your name attached to it so that we can follow-up if there are any questions; this feedback is considered confidential for P&A members, unless you note that you are comfortable with your name being shared with staff.

The questions congregation members are invited to reflect on and provide insight for staff are:

1. In what ways has the staff person been particularly effective or successful as you worked with her/him/them and/or observed her/him/them?
2. What should she/he/they keep doing?
3. Anything that didn't go so well?
4. What could she/he/they do differently or better?
5. When you look at the values we lift up as a congregation, what are one or two examples of how you have seen staff incorporate the values into their work and ministry?
6. Any comments or compliments that you would like us to pass along?

We appreciate your thoughts as we lift up our staff and the work that they carry out on behalf of the congregation. Again, any feedback is requested by June 1st.

Reconciling in Christ: Note from the St. Michael's Church Council

Over the last twenty years St. Michael's has taken many steps to make known its welcome to individuals who identify as LGBTQ+ and their families. These steps have included education hours and forums, clergy performing same-gender marriages, approving the use of facilities for same-gender weddings or blessings, calling and employing LGBTQ+ clergy and staff, mindfulness around all gender restrooms, crafting a blessings/naming ceremony for those who identify as transgender, and approving a welcome statement as a congregation. As part of the work we have done and will continue to do, the St. Michael's church council will vote at its August 13, 2019, meeting on becoming a Reconciling in Christ Congregation. The RIC identification connects us with other congregations who have publicly expressed welcome and support; is a way to be publicly visible to individuals and families seeking a welcoming congregation; and becomes an additional means of outreach.

Pastor Ali and Pastor Brad will be leading Coffee/Lemonade Conversations in June and July to further acquaint people with Reconciling in Christ and what it means for the congregation and welcoming others in the community. All St. Michael's council meetings are open to members of the congregation, so members are also welcome to come and join in the conversation at any time.

We continue to live into our values of Expansive Welcome and Generous Hospitality as seek ways to publicly express our support for all of God's people.
