## Shared Ministry: Part II

From the Congregational President - Chuck Hanson

St. Michael's Lutheran Church has been blessed with a congregation that knows what it means to step forward in service. That service includes work such as committee membership, worship leaders, Women's Circles, Loaves and Fishes, BeFrienders, Habitat for Humanity, Rezek House, and many more. This commitment to service extends to our members' daily lives in helping friends, families, and neighbors near and far. It is out of that ethic of service that St. Michael's embodies what it means to share in ministry. I have been thinking a lot about what a commitment to "shared ministry" means to me and to our community. When we work together in ministry, we are better equipped for the "long haul" of ministering. A community-wide commitment to a model of "shared ministry" allows me – allows us – to go deeper into being the kind of servant Christ calls me, calls us, to be.



Shared ministry is rooted in invitation, inviting each of us to discern ways we might use our individual gifts to be of service to our community at St. Michael's, our neighbors in Roseville, and our brothers and sisters around the world. A ministry I've been invited into is BeFrienders, a ministry of *listening* and *being* with someone in a time of need. The BeFriender ministry was nowhere on my mind three years ago when Pastor Brad asked if I would consider leading this ministry with Ruth Petersen. Unbeknownst to Brad was that I had just been spending time with an old high school classmate who was battling cancer. The time with my classmate and Brad asking me to become involved overlapped as if it had been part of a well thought out plan, it wasn't, it was timing. The joy of leading BeFrienders with Ruth is rooted in invitation and shared ministry.

Pastor Brad wrote in the June newsletter of conversations within the Personnel & Administration Committee and the Church Council about moving toward a shared pastoral ministry model as "co-pastors" within the congregation. It is a conversation dating back over 40 years at St. Michael's and one that several congregations within our metro area have already committed to. It is one that will hold up our two pastors – Pastor Brad and Pastor Ali – formally recognizing the equal calling they each put into action through their ministry among us. Shifting to adopting a pastoral model of "co-pastors" is one that truly excites me as a way of recognizing our ethic of shared ministry and helping us move forward together as the servants God calls us to be. To quote Pastor Brad "Living out our value of Authentic Relationships means that we are responsible to and for one another and that each person is further equipped to use their gifts for ministry in this place and in this world." Together, within a community committed to a model of shared ministry, we will be better able to make an impact in the world. That is a community I desire to be a part of.

## Youth Room Plans


As I shared in last month's newsletter, we have big plans for our Youth Room revamp! One of the projects is a mural! Our mural will be on multiple tiles of canvas, creating a mosaic type mural. A few reasons we chose this style, instead of putting it directly on the wall, was because we wanted involvement of the whole congregation of St. Michael's and that if one day the space is repurposed, the art can be moved to a different location, if needed. St. Michael's youth want to be good stewards of this space and making something permanent felt contradictory to that. We know that as needs change in the congregation and the community, the structure of the building may need to change as well.

As High School students travel to Toledo, OH, this summer, youth and adults will be looking closer at their own story, God's story, and our story together as a community, as we live out in the world.

The word "community" keeps coming up in our conversations as we look at the revamp of the youth room. The community of St. Michael's and the community *around* St. Michael's. We will be sharing more about this and the mural project as we return from our Service Learning Trip in August.

In late August, we will be working with Michelle Walka. Michelle is a Deaconess of the ELCA and a rostered ministry of Word and Service. Michelle will help our youth dive deeper into the story our youth want to tell with our mural. Michelle will work with St. Michael's using creative community practices and foster space for us to dwell in God's story.

## Guatemala Partnership

As summer in Minnesota spreads us further distances with vacations, lake visits and camping trips, we look forward to reuniting in support of our friends in Cimiento as the program year returns.

The Guatemala Gala will take place on October 2 this fall, raising money for Education Programs of the Iglesia Luterana Agustina de Guatemala (ILAG). St. Michael's recently approved a lead gift for the Gala of \$1000.

What for more updates on the church building project taking place at Santa Cruz de la Esperanza and the planning for the fall Gala!

## Refugee Resettlement Committee

Here's a brief update on the Afghan families that St. Michael's is assisting.

### A little review:

You may remember that we were asked by the Minnesota Council of Churches last fall to co-sponsor one Afghan young couple—Jamuillah and Guldosta—who arrived in Minnesota in October. Their first child, baby girl Shkula, was born shortly after they arrived.

Sometime later, two additional families--Jamiullah's cousin Hazrat and his wife Salma, and Guldosta's uncle Hayat, his wife Razmina and their four young children—arrived in St. Paul. These families also were sponsored by the Minnesota Council of Churches, but they were not fortunate enough to be assigned to a co-sponsor like St. Michael's, so we offered to help them informally as much as possible.

### What's happening now:

#### New baby:

Hazrat and Salma welcomed baby Aryan in late May. Aryan is being seen at the University of Minnesota for a possible metabolic disorder. To date, we do not know if this disorder is severe, but we are aware that a special formula is recommended for him, increasing costs to the family.

#### A time of transition:

Since they have been in the United States now for six months, the three families have reached, or will soon reach, the date when they no longer are eligible for support from the Minnesota Council of Churches. This is a time of transition when they must begin paying more of their own expenses, like food, rent, and utilities. However, they are eligible for

support through the Minnesota Department of Human Services Resettlement Programs and the Afghan Cultural Society, and caseworkers have been assigned to assist them. St. Michael's also intends to continue its support for these families as they work through this challenging time.

The three men in our families are all employed at a plastics assembly facility in Eagan (They use Uber to travel to and from work.)

All three men have passed their Minnesota driver permit tests, and the Afghan Cultural Society will help them study for the behind-the-wheel test.

All the adults plan to attend online summer English classes offered through the Hubbs Center of the St. Paul schools.

Some additional ways St. Michael's is involved:

Through the Bikes for Kids program, we've found almost-brand-new bikes for the adult men—that come with helmets and locks.

The team is setting up opportunities for volunteers to read to the four young boys in Hayat and Razmina's family so they can hear English spoken.

We continue to provide transportation to doctor and dentist visits, shopping trips, and more.

Members of the committee have researched food shelves in the area and have found some excellent sources of free food, as well as a possibility that one of the food shelves will deliver food to their homes.

#### **Thank you:**

Recently members of the congregation have donated a car seat, electric bassinet, baby swing, crib, books and toys, kitchen appliances and tools, fabric, and food to these families. They are very grateful, and so are we.

Expenses continue, and we welcome any additional donations from our community. You have been very generous.

#### **How to learn more:**



# A Church at Work

## Church Council Corner

The St. Michael's Church Council met on Tuesday, June 14. at 7:00 p.m.

Council made note of the nine members who joined the congregation this past month.

Primary action items of the council this month included:

- Authorizing work to repair the patching of holes and degrading areas of the church parking lot.
- Contracting with Olson Advancement to conduct a feasibility study as we look at a potential capital campaign. The feasibility study will be conducted this August through October with a report to council at the October meeting.
- The council also continued conversation around our values of Authentic Relationship and Vibrant Faith & Worship.

Additionally, the council received thank you notes from Lutheran Social Services of Minnesota (one for St. Michael's work with Rezek House; another for individual and congregational support for items gifted to help a refugee family from Ukraine); and from staff and individuals from St. Anthony High School who hosted a dinner and concert here at St. Michael's.

The next church council meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 14, 2022, 8:15 p.m.

\*At the Annual Meeting on January 30, 2022, the congregation approved use of Reserve Funds (the carryover income from 2021) to balance budget, if needed at the end of the year. This is included in the Annual Approved budget of \$874,359.

## SMART Update (St. Michael's Assessment & Reopening Team)

St. Michael's is continuing with masks being **optional**, but **encourages people to wear face masks** as an extra measure of precaution. We also ask that people adjust (or readjust) to create more physical distance in group settings (3'-6' if possible).

Additionally, we ask everyone to be mindful of the symptoms of COVID-19. **Should you have symptom** we ask the following:

1. Get tested (because of the rise in cases we cannot disregard symptoms and simply say "It's just a cold." or "It's just allergies.")
2. If you are exhibiting symptoms please refrain from coming to worship and church activities until you have had a COVID-19 test
3. Even with a negative at home test it is possible to have a false-negative, and we would ask anyone who is experiencing symptoms—even with a negative test—to follow safety protocols and wear a mask for additional protection in the context of the community.

Current COVID-19 Protocols:

- Mask optional
  - The team encourages all who feel comfortable wearing masks to continue to wear them.
  - The church will continue to provide KN95/N95 masks to use for those who would like them.
  - This is be consistent across all ages and spaces.
- Continuous Communion in worship
  - We will come forward in a line (we ask that people maintain a 3' distance between those in front of and behind them), receiving bread and wine/juice in small cups.

- Return of the Children's PrayGround in worship
  - The children's PrayGround is set up again at the back of the sanctuary.
  - The church will provide masks for any children/families who would like them and do not have their own.
- Light funeral/memorial refreshments, food at community gatherings
  - Refreshments for gatherings at the church are allowed.
  - Coffee hours between services will be dependent on congregational volunteers.
