Forgive us when we have destroyed the environment, erased places of shelter for animals, polluted the waters, killed off food supplies or neglected to feed or tend animals in our own communities.

God is love. Through Christ our sins are forgiven. Holy One, may we learn see your presence in all creation, and especially as you call us to care for animals and see them as companions in our pilgrimage on earth. **Amen**.
