<u><i>Calls for Repentance</i></u>	<u><i>Announcement of Judgment</i></u>	<u><i>Announcement of Hope</i></u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Threat • Future contingent on human action in response (e.g., repentance) • Can have the tone of discipline/chastisement 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No escape -- survival at best • Cry for mercy is in order, but no guarantee that it will alter the future (lamentation). Too late for repentance as a way to alter the future • Has a stated rationale or reason 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Not contingent on human action • Motivation resides in God's character
<p style="text-align: center;">A Key Expression: "If..., then" / "or else"</p> <p>(Unqualified hope announced here is false prophecy). Imperatives: Turn, wash, etc.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">A Key Expression: "Therefore" ("Because")</p> <p>(Hope announced here is false prophecy)</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">A Key Expressions: "But now" or "I will"</p> <p>(Beyond the limits of human imagination and, therefore, not limited by human categories)</p>

[NRSV]</p> <hr style="width: 20%; margin: 10px auto;"/> <p>Hosea 1: Not My People Amos 8: THE END</p> <p>(More than disruption)</p>	<p>Jeremiah 31:31-34 31 The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. 32 It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt-- a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. 33 But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. 34 No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the LORD," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.
